Dremel Tools with Tedge ~ February Demonstration

The February demo was cut a bit short because we couldn't get into the venue till late. Tedge demonstrated some glass etching and pyrography outside before we were able to get in and then setup some hands on demonstrations of Dremel equipment.

Members seem to be most interested in the Versatip 2000 (A cordless 6 in 1 gas torch for soldering, pyrography, melting, shrinking, hot cutting and paint removal) and the 2500 Multi Vice (clamps to any workbench and can be rotated 360° and tilts up to 50°. She also demonstrated the Moto saw (a small scroll saw) and some of the cordless rotary tools.



Making your own Sanding Mandrels with Noel ~ March Demonstration

Norski 421 Resin is mixed in a 4 to 1 ratio and poured into a empty Resene testpot container. An 8mm bolt is used as the mandrels shaft. This is pushed down into the resin and a gas blow torch is used to pull any bubbles up out of the wet resin. The top of the test pot has a hole for the 8mm bolt to hold it centered as the resin hardens





A peg is used on the 8mm bolt to stop it sliping right to the bottom of the wet resin. After the resin has hardened it can be shaped on the lathe using a Jacobs chuck. A wood spacer is used between the resin and the tail stock to stop the Jacobs chuck being pulled out of the headstock while you are shaping the resin

The thread section of the bolt can now be removed using an angle grinder. Noel uses 8mm bolts because he finds the 6mm too small in diameter for the drill chuck to grip properly and the slippage can damage both the shaft and the chuck. The diameter of the resin where it is glued to the rubber should be about 50mm.

Eco Shed as old swimming kick boards. The F38 is applied to both surfaces and left till it is almost dry – just a little bit tacky before the two surfaces are forced together.



This is for a mandrel to take 75mm paper. Ados F38 is used as a contact adhesive because it can take the high heat required when sanding. A firm rubber is required for the backing. It can be purchased from Para-rubber or more cheaply from the





Noel has a mandrel for each grit of paper he uses and a quick-change mechanism so that he can quickly change from one grit to the next. When he is power sanding the inside of bowls he first sands with the bowl stationary to fix up any tool marks or tear out then spins the bowl on the lathe. The first grit is used to remove all imperfections. The higher grits just remove the scratches from lower grits. Once dry the rubber can be turned down with a taper from the 50mm resin to about 70mm for the Velcro end. This end is turned to 70mm so that it is slightly smaller than the 75mm sandpaper so that the sandpaper always covers the end.



As well as giving you affordable and discounted access through demonstrations and tutorials, to top overseas and New Zealand teachers, there are many inter-club events in the NAW calendar that give members an opportunity to mix socially and to trade ideas and techniques. This is especially true of participatory events.

Members have access to the NAW Education Opportunity Grants Programme, typically to help with expenses for traveling, tuition and workshops. As a member of NAW you are not only part of the active woodskills community in New Zealand but you also have access to the worldwide woodturning and woodcrafting community.
