

PRESIDENTS REPORT for 2019 as presented to the AGM

Having a strong committee is essential as evidenced by the fact that I started my third term by being away on holiday for two months. In October, several members went down to Oamaru to see the Australian demonstrator Vaughn Richmond run a hands on demonstration week end. Peter and Noel got involved with the Rekindle group in November learning how to use a bungy lathe, and doing a follow up demonstration in July. Our Christmas event went off well with the project theme being "Beads of Courage "boxes, which were then given to the Child Cancer Society. Around Christmas time was a major time in our club history when we took ownership of our own workshop facilities at Riccarton. The hall itself cost us only \$5000 and we pay a small annual lease amount to the Council for the land itself. The hall itself was completely rewired over the Christmas holidays by a new member Dave Murray, whilst some early modifications were being made. The legal paperwork was handled also by a club member for mates rates. A special thanks to Noel Graham and Joe Hayes for being the driving force behind equipping the hall for the learner classes and the new members. We plan on a couple of painting /maintenance days soon before we have an official opening day in August.

Once again, we were at the "Hello Hornby" event this year. Being able to utilize our new hall, meant that we could host another Robert Sorby demonstration day, and have an Australian demonstrator Neil Turner come and do a demonstration day for us. About a dozen members went down to Oamaru for the Fun Day event in May, being able to field two teams.



May Demonstration ~ Thread Chasing/Cutting by Peter Clemett

Peter explained how he had come to grips with thread chasing by researching turning magazines and U tube. The choice of a suitable reasonably hard dense even wood is essential, and showed us a selection of various woods and materials that he had tried out with varying degrees of success. Several pair of Chasing tools were shown, with 16-20 threads per inch, and read out a 10 point item list for best results (probably in the next newsletter) Peter then prepared a piece of apple for the female thread, stressing the need for a relief groove at the bottom of the threaded section. A piece of Aki Aki was prepared for the male piece, again with a relief groove for the chaser. After the speed was reduced to about 400 R.P.M. (about the maximum suggested) the female piece was set up again and the thread was cut. The chasing tool starts off at an angle to the centre line, and is slowly fed into the hole in a rectangular/circular motion with the tool slowly finishing up parallel to the centre line and the full depth and length of the thread required, you need to practice...The Aki Aki male piece was set up and the section to be threaded was turned down to approximately the diameter of the bottom of the female thread, and a small section, the internal diameter of the female thread, was turned at the start of the section as a depth indicator. The thread was then cut in much the same manner, with the piece being tried against the female thread, then skimmed and recut slightly a couple of times until a good fit was achieved. Another excellent well prepared demo by Peter and look forward to the hands on night... Rick (scribe)






June Demonstration Dick Veitch


