April Demonstration "Resin" with Andy Goust

There are four different types of casting resin and each has its own properties. These are Epoxy Resin, Uv Resin, Polyester Resin and Polyurethane Resin.

The majority of resins are made up of two elements, namely the base resin and a catalyst (which is often called the hardener). Andy demonstrated a pour using a Clear epoxy Casting Resin from Liquid Polymer Glass Ltd. This takes about three days to set enough to be able to turn. Andy makes his molds from PTFE, usually purchased as cutting boards. The Resin does not bond with the PTFE so no release compound is required. He has a removable side on the mold that is screwed into place. Any small gaps are then sealed with a silicon sealent to stop leaks.

The important thing is to get to know the characteristics of the Resin you are using especially the working and setting time.

Andy uses a pressure pot to reduce the size of any bubbles that might be caught in the resin. The pressure used depends on the caricteristics of your pot.

Saturday 29th May 9am to 4pm at the Auburn Reserve Workshop (the \$5 Workshop fee applies)

9am If you have not turned a pen before we will start you off with a Fancy Thinline Pen kit and a wood pen blank and go through the process. All the tools you require will be available at the workshop. If you have a Spindle Roughing Gouge bring it along. Also we like you to supply your own sandpaper.

The Fancy Thinline Pen Kits will be \$5. Wooden pen blanks are free.

10am If you are already familiar with pen turning and would like to make a pen other than the Fancy Thinline kits that we have available, we would ask you to get your own pen kits from one of the suppliers below. We will have instructions, drill bits and bushes for Polaris, Sierra, and Bolt Action pens available at the workshop.

There will be a demonstration of pouring your own resin pen blanks at around 10am or just after so that they will be solid by 4pm (not ready to turn but solid enough to handle) This will include colouring and how to stop embedded contents floating, painting the inner tube and the use of pressure pots to reduce bubbles. If you would like to turn something other than wood we suggest that you buy some acrylic pen blanks from the companies listed below.
