Change of venue for the April meeting

Fendalton Community Hall 170 Clyde Road

As the Harvard Lounge is being refurbished, the council provided the Fendalton Community Hall for our meetings in March and April.

The community hall is at 170 Clyde Road, approximately mid way between Jeffreys Road and the Memorial Ave/ Fendalton Road intersections.

There is some parking on site to the right of the hall and street parking on Clyde Road.

Timaru is hosting the Woodturning 'Fun Day' Event on 28 May

The format for this year's "Fun Day" will be much the same as in past years.

- Each club fields two teams of 3 turners who will compete to produce 3 sets of turned item in 2 parts. In 2020 it was a bat and ball, with the first team of 3 making the bat and the second team making the ball, each within a 50 minute time frame. The object is make each set as near to identical as possible without the aid of measuring tools, pen/pencils or sandpaper.
- Further details for this year's event to be confirmed in due course.
- Each club will also have a table on which to display items made to reflect this year's "Fun Day" theme "Home is where the heart is".



- Items on each display table will be judged according to a set of published criteria and prizes for different categories will be awarded following a critique from the NAW guest of honour.
- Timaru are hoping to have a guest demonstrator to entertain all while the judging process takes place.

South Island Fun Day – an explanation

Type: A fun day of friendly interclub competition and fellowship.

The detail of the programme varies at the discretion of the organiser, but broadly follows a similar pattern which includes: a team turning competition; a Club display table competition; Best-in-Show competition; and a mystery challenge.

There is prize money on offer for Competition placegetters, sponsored by the NAW.

Come along to take part in the turning, display your work, or just support your Club.

Format: One day – usually a Saturday from 9:00-3:00

When:	Annual, usually during May		
	We will advertise the event in our Club Newsletter once details are available.		
Host Club:	Rotates around South Island Clubs. Clubs usually host for two successive years before passing on the reigns. Current (2021) host is the Timaru Woodturners Club		
Venue:	Host Club will advise		
Cost:	Free to attend and participate.		
	The host Club usually puts on a light lunch for a minor charge, payable on the day.		
Registrations: Not required.			
	However, our Club needs to register the teams for the turning competition, so if we'll want anyone interested to participating to commit early. Teams consist of 6 persons, with a mix of experience.		
Equipment:	Bring you own tools and PPE if turning.		
	If you wish to enter a piece of your work in the show or table competitions, let one of our committee know in advance and either bring it along with you on the day or have someone else do so.		
Other:	W R Owen Turning Supplies shop is usually set up on the day		

The host Club usually runs a raffle.

Notes for Attendees

- The fun Team Turning event competes for the Tina Turner Trophy. One or more teams of 6 are entered by Clubs, and there's frequently a mixed team made up of "extras". The competition is run as a relay over an allotted time, where each turner produces a single item. The goal is to make matched sets of items by eye only no measuring devices, pencils or sandpaper are permitted. The turning sessions are typically run in two blocks of three pieces each, lasting about an hour. The team with the closest to identical sets wins. Past competition topics have been: balls and skittles; wig stands; plate, bottle, and stopper; rolling pin and cookie cutter; etc.
- All skill levels can take part in the team turning. We will know the topic beforehand and run practice sessions at our workshop for those taking part.


At the March Meeting

Show and Tell

Ray Hall showed a small Kumiko project he had just completed, a small stand / decorative piece that relies on friction only for assembly. The Kumiko project was run over two evenings by the <u>Guild of Woodworkers Canterbury</u>. Ray's challenge now is to incorporate Kumiko designs into his woodturning, perhaps a box lid. Kumiko is a Japanese technique of assembling wooden pieces without the use of nails. Thinly slit wooden pieces are grooved, punched and mortised, and then fitted individually using a plane,



saw, chisel and other tools to make fine adjustments. The technique was developed in Japan in the Asuka Era (1603-1868). <u>Wikipedia</u>

Mark Teeboon's Kraut Pounder

Several months ago my wife asked me to make a Kraut pounder as she had been told sauerkraut was great for gut health. So the challenge was set for me to come up with a nice instrument to do the job. I had a look at a few examples on line and they were all a bit boring so I put a bit of wood on the lathe and started to shape a pounder, I was interrupted so had to come back to it. I took it to the club and played with the shape and settled on the shape I am making now (right).

Since I posted the first couple on my Facebook page the interest has been amazing with both with the pounder and the recipe. The recipe (Link) we have been using was found on YouTube and can be found at "Mary's Nest". She has a lot of interesting recipes available and there are a few more I want to try.





As a fair amount of muscle

is required when making sauerkraut the pounder definitely makes the job a bit easier.

Lacking a demonstrator for the night, we were fortunate that Noel volunteered to demonstrate the making of small hats.

Demonstration of making small hats – Noel Graham

Noel took us through the process of making small hats starting with a timber blank that still had some moisture left in it and mounting it so that the grain ran across the lathe bed as one would for a bowl.

First step was to roughly define the shape and turn the tenon for remounting on the chuck.

The exterior of the hat was shaped, some decoration applied to the hat band and the brim completed before starting on the hollowing of the hat. Whilst fingers were deemed sufficient to measure the thickness of the brim, a light shining through the crown of the hat provided an easy way to assess wall thickness during the hollowing.



The depth inside of the crown was checked to ensure there was enough wood left at the top for finishing of the crown. The hat was then reversed and





remounted on the chuck, expanding the jaws in the base of the crown taking care not to expand them too much and so splitting the hat.

Noel finished the crown with with a dished centre. A light can be shone through the headstock as an aid to avoid cutting through the top of the hat.



As the hat continues to dry, it will distort and that can be enhanced with a little extra pressure from rubber bands or tape.



Show table competition and project display

There was only one entry in the show table in March. Admittedly meeting attendance was well down on previous months, attributable in part to the temporary change of venue and Omicron but show table entry numbers have been declining for some time.

At the last meeting Ray challenged all members (including himself) to bring something for the show table competition or for display only table.

Show Table Rules

- Entries accepted only from financial members of the Club who are present at the meeting
- Articles must have been constructed in the past 6 months and not entered in a previous show table
- No more than 2 articles per month any additional items will be deemed for "show and tell"
- Placings determined by count of votes submitted by members present at the meeting
 - Points awarded as follows:
 - 1 point per entrant,
 - regardless of the number of pieces entered
 - In addition:
 - Ist place = 3 points,
 - 2nd place = 2 points,
 - 3rd place = 1 point
- Show Table Trophy awarded at the Christmas meeting each year for most points accumulated from show table entries during the calendar year.

This is for anything you want to share with other members or get feedback on. It may be a jig, finished or unfinished project, unusual tool or anything else related to woodturning.
