 Rattles for Christchurch Hospital See this note on making a rattle from past Life Member Rex Marshall <u>Baby rattle PDF</u> When making rattles, be careful not to put seeds, beans, etc in them as they may be confiscated at the border if you take them overseas. Nuts and



bolts would be ideal. The suggested rattle design does not have captive rings as they can break and be a choking hazard.

 <u>Beads of courage boxes</u> for children who collect the beads as they go through hospital treatments. Picture shows some of the boxes made in 2016.



3. Wig stands. See <u>https://sawg.org.nz/wordpress/wp-content/uploads/2011/09/Wig-Stand.pdf</u> and <u>https://www.gww.org.nz/wig-stands</u> for dimensions. There is no single spec for a wig stand. The two documents cited have the diameter of the dome 100-140mm, height 300-350mm and base diameter 150-160mm. The design of the stem offers a chance to be creative and following on from last month's demonstration of making barley twists, one member has already made a wig stand with a barley twist stem.

Demonstration at the June Club Meeting

David Caddie took us through the process he uses to make barley twists. David emphasised that careful marking out was the key to getting a uniform twist. Then with careful carving, sanding and finishing you should get a good result.
