Direct sale of turned wood items – David Williams-Jones



Further to the last meetings heads up, \$394 worth of items were sold at the West Melton market. For those where we agreed a minimum price for an item, the actual prices achieved were 31% higher.

Actual sales were hindered by the blustery winds (making it difficult to display some items, particularly those supplied by Gavin and some of Mark's smaller seamstress items), the threat of rain and the timing of the market over a long weekend. Conversely, numbers were helped by some of my friends showing support in a practical way!

I am happy to try again and plan to go to the next market in early March. Too early to assess exactly what does and does not sell but Ray Morgan, there was quite a bit of interest in your monster pepper grinders so if you are wondering what to turn over the next month...

How will it work:

Any CWA member looking to clear a few items that they have turned would bring these for collection at the regular Wednesday Club night meeting. For each item offered, a description and minimum acceptable price would be agreed. Contacts would be swapped and a 'receipt' issued. After the sale, results would be communicated to all members involved with cash / unsold items returned at the following Club meeting (or via bank transfer beforehand).

David Williams-Jones would manage, finance and communicate the entire process. Members involvement would be simply one of supply of items if they wish and receipt of cash/ returned stock.

What now:

It is planned that a small trial takes place at the February market to gauge interest. The first sale of items submitted by members will take place on March 5th with items being collected at the Club night on February 22nd. Look forward to seeing you and your surplus items then.

NZ Woodturning Events By Peter Clemett

Demonstrations and Events are significant features of woodturning life in NZ and are generally accessible to all members of woodturning clubs and guilds.

There are Clubs around the country which regularly host weekend (multi-day) events during the year. Others are single day only. Usually, they are open to participants from anywhere and invitations to register are emailed to other Clubs to distribute or posted on the NAW website (see *Upcoming Events* at https://naw.org.nz/). The idea of most of these is that you go along with your tools and lathe (or arrange to borrow a lathe off the host) and have a fun weekend turning and interacting with the other participants.

Each event has a slightly different approach to how it is run, so it pays to do your homework if you are after a specific type of experience. Some are organised around a guest demonstrator who presents a series of projects for you to follow. Others may set individual or team challenges or be focussed on teaching new skills. Alternatively, you can do your own thing all weekend and just enjoy the company if that's what you prefer.

My opinion is that these events represent great value for the learning of new techniques and project ideas to put into practice. Skill level (or lack of) is no barrier to taking part. There is always someone there who will lend advice and a guiding hand to help you develop your own ideas and skills. You also get to meet fellow turners from other parts of the country and to extend your network of like-minded folk.

Please be aware, and come prepared, that the surrounding forest/weather conditions can lead to sandflys and wasps. If there has been a lot of rain, there will be mud on the walking track/road.

The workroom, main hall (for dining, social, Bill's shop etc.), and accommodation huts are all separate buildings, apart from each other – a 50m walk and stair-climb from workroom to hall, and 200m walk and a gentle climb to the sleeping huts. There is drive-up access to each if required, but many folk just walk between. You will need a good parka and footwear though if it's raining, and a torch will be useful after dark.

Club meeting on Wednesday 25 January – report

Despite appearances, Noel was not dishing out spiritual guidance but some practical advice on various options for the application of colour.

Options covered included; the use of water and spirit based dyes, ebonising of wood, liming wax, burning and various clear and other finishes.

A practical demonstration was given on the application of stains with suggestions as to how to avoid bleeding of the stain into the surrounding wood and avoid splatter by having the cloth up against the work before starting the lathe.



Noel then went on to demonstrate a marbling technique where the object is rotated as it is dipped into water, the surface of which has been sprayed with different coloured paints. See examples below.
