The new shed at the workshop

If you have been to the workshop lately you will have noticed a few changes, on the concrete pad behind the club rooms we now have a storage shed with raised floor for ventilation and an electricity supply so you are not in the dark.



This shed provides us with storage space for the supplies of wood required for courses and demonstrations. Some wood may be available for personal projects but ask first.

It has also freed up space inside the workshop so we can be better organised for courses, general woodturning, pyrography etc..





Any decent shed must have power and lighting but you cannot just run an extension cord out to the shed when needed. We had to make sure that you and anyone that might want to plant a tree were safe. External signs for the buried cables and internally, strip lighting, fuse box and power socket.

Pen making session Wednesday 7 June at 7pm

South Island Fun Day 2023

Date: Saturday 27th May 2023Approx 9am until 3pmVenue: Harvard Lounge, WigramThe fun day event is open to all South Island clubs. It is our turn to host the event this year and we will be
looking in April for members to participate in the competition and others to help with the running of the
event.

For the competition, teams of 6 turners will compete to produce two sets of 3 identical items. The object is make each set as near to identical as possible without the aid of measuring tools, pen/pencils or sandpaper.

The Competition project is to make three Porridge Spurtles and three Porridge Bowls. Blanks provided are 300mm x 30 mm square for the spurtle and 180mm diameter x 70mm deep for the porridge bowl.

Each club will also have a table on which to display items made by members during the year. There is no specified theme, that has been left to the clubs to decide for themselves. However, there must be a minimum of two spindle turned and two cross grain pieces with a maximum of ten pieces.

Club meeting on Wednesday 26 April – report

The programme featured Keith Hake on Working with Resin *"I generally get my resin from Liquid Polymer Glass owned and operated by Michael Engel. There isn't a web site, call only to place your orders.*

I strongly suggest chatting with Michael about what you are planning to use his resin for, he will be more than happy to talk for ages about it but you will at the end of the call have a wealth of knowledge.

Helpful tips using resin:

1. Try working with resin to weigh, this WILL be more accurate than hoping the calculation is correct with measuring resin which was definitely my demise with far too much frothing due to inaccurate mixes.

 Never rely on your first mix of resin being mixed correctly. Mix as required but always pour into another mixing container to ensure any base that hasn't been mixed doesn't hinder the curing process giving you a tacky and soft cure.
Dispose of your first mix container, this is no use to you for future mixes and can tempt you to "give it another go and hope all is good".

4. Introducing items to be encapsulated in a bowl: Try mixing a small amount of resin, pour a shallow amount where you are looking to set the items in such as shells, sewing items, coins, keys to name a few. This will allow you to move the items around without leaving a PVA glue residue that takes unwanted extra work to remove. Also ensure the lowest edges of items are covered to stop air escaping thus giving you bubbles escaping.

5. Wet sanding: Add a small amount of washing up liquid to the water to help lubricate the contact. M10 goes up to 2000 grit. Terry does the sanding pads which are very good https://www.timberlywoodturning.co.nz/





6. Yorkshire grit: This is a must! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=LycG72QaHQE . Carl Jacobson gives a small demo. Terry also has this https://www.timberlywoodturning.co.nz/

7. If you use coloured pencils I like to add a fine coat of C.A. glue to seal the crayons in on the surface after all wet sanding and polishing is complete. Make sure all pencils/wood is completely dry prior to adding C.A. glue.

8. Resene auto might give you a sample of polishing compound if you ask nicely... I did and I got! Happy resining guys. Keith. "

Noel Graham gave us a demonstration on the making of a spurtle for the fun day competition. Relatively straight forward, the first turner should keep it simple so that the second and third turners can make the spirtle as close as possible to the first.

For the porridge bowls, the blanks will be pre-drilled for a screw chuck to turn the base of the bowl. Simplicity is the key, a recess for mounting the bowl might be an easier to repeat option than making a tenon for the foot.
