



## **October Monthly Meeting Demo**

Keith McFadden - box lid inserts

Keith McFadden demonstrated making boxes with various lids. A tip to fit a finial to a lid is to make the hole angled, and the finial angled. The finial will then slot into the hole perfectly.

The demonstration was making a plug (like a cork) for a bowl lid that he made earlier. He made a jig to ensure his angle of his plug is the same each time, and the angle of the hole is the same as the plug or finial.

After making the plug, he changed the chuck and mounted the bowl. The plug is to go into the bowl lid like a cork, so he measured the plug and the hole he has made in the lid to ensure a tight fit.

Once the hole is big enough to leave the plug proud, he then glues it in place. Voila, you have a box with a plug-like handle on the lid. Pretty cool!







modified by making a couple of larger button holders. They ensure an offset piece turns securely without the fear of it flying off the lathe. He already turned the plug. Once the plugs are in, Keith said you have a choice to leave it proud, shape it, or turn it flush with the lid.

## **EVENT REPORT: Spin Around 2025**

The end of October has been and gone, and with it the annual Spin Around weekend event hosted by the Waitaki Woodturners Guild. As one of the very few South Island Club events on the woodturning calendar, Spin Around is typically well attended by host Club members and those from around the country. This year there were 8 from our Club, standing alongside visitors from Hawkes Bay, Martinborough, Nelson, Otago, and no doubt some other places I didn't take note of. The workshop was certainly full, and I'd be surprised if it was possible to squeeze too many more lathes in.

For those who have attended Spin Around before, the format will be familiar. A guest demonstrator/tutor is invited each year to challenge attendees with a range of projects, new ideas, and new twists on familiar techniques. Over the course of the weekend there at least 4 project demonstrations. After each demo there's plenty of time in the workshop to have a go at what you've just seen. Projects are usually pitched to allow participants of all abilities to have a go. The demonstrator is there to guide and coach those who need it, and of course other participants are always willing to offer advice or lend you that tool you don't own or didn't pack.

This year, Paul Barton from Victoria, Australia led the weekend. Paul's demos and projects were all themed around thin-wall hollow forms and simple (some would say, sneaky) ways of hollowing them to disguise the approach. These certainly caught the imagination of participants, and it was great to see the impromptu gallery of finished pieces grow over the course of the weekend.

As well as the demos and turning, Bill Owen had his shop up and running to satisfy that urge for a new tool or simply to replenish consumables. There were also the regular competition trophies to be competed for, including the Founders Trophy for best entry submitted by an attending Club. Last year this was won by Christchurch, and we had a repeat victory this time for our entry of a double bowl with natural edge "handles". This piece was again a collaboration - Andrew Biggs joining Stuart Camp and Peter Clemett to design and produce the piece. Next year we're keen for our Club secure the hat-trick and would like to encourage others to take up the challenge and have a go. The trophy itself resides permanently in the Waitaki Club rooms, so a photo is unfortunately all we have to show for it.

All in all, it was another fantastic weekend of good company, good food, and all things woodturning. I most definitely recommend Spin Around to anyone who's never been to an event before. The experience and learning opportunities make it a first-rate occasion and it's so accessible – just a wee drive down south. As for next year's demonstrator, I hear the Waitaki team is in discussion with Giulio Marcolongo about a return, which will be fantastic if it all works out.
